1. FAIR DISTRICT - The Fair is open to everyone and anyone.
2. This booklet will be used yearly, with a small supplement book inserted with year specific information in it. Please keep your copy in a handy place to refer to is throughout the year as you create new items to enter each year.
3. ENTRY FEE - The entry fee for each individual exhibit (for competition) shall be 50 cents for adult entries and 25 cents for youth entries. Youth entering in adult categories will pay 50 cents for those entries. There is no entry fee for “display-only” exhibits.
4. ALL EXHIBITS must be delivered to the fair location and received by the fair committee members 9am and 3:00pm on Saturday The entry form and exhibit cards must be completed and must accompany the entries.
5. IN EVERY CLASS the entry must never have been entered in a previous Ashcroft and District Fall Fair. All items for entry must be grown, raised or made by the exhibitor in whose name it is entered. Children are welcome to enter any adult categories.
6. ONLY ARTICLES LISTED in the entry book may be entered, however, each section has sufficient “Open Class” to allow for a large variety of entries. Please read the sections carefully for guidelines and qualifications.
7. IN EACH SECTION THERE ARE LIMITS (usually one) to the number of entries allowed per competitor, per class. (Ex. You may enter D1, D2 , D3, etc., but you cannot enter 2 items in D1)
8. DISPLAY ONLY ITEMS will be accepted - no entry fee will be charged. Entry forms and entry cards should be clearly marked “DISPLAY ONLY”. Items for Display Only will not be judged. The owner’s name may be displayed.
9. ONLY COMMITTEE MEMBERS or those duly appointed by them will be allowed to take, carry, distribute or arrange entries to location of exhibit tables. The Fair Committee may give special permission to those requiring set-up time for their exhibit.
10. The Fall Fair reserves the right to make changes to the placement of an entry.
11. ONLY JUDGES AND AUTHORIZED OFFICIALS wearing proper identification tags will be allowed in the place of the exhibition while judging is in progress.

12. IN THE ABSENCE OF ANY COMPETITION in a section, the judges will award prizes only as they see fit. A single entry in any section does not necessarily guarantee a first, second or third place award. Decision of the Judge is final.

14. THE ASSOCIATION reserves the right to pro-rate prize lists: 1st \$3.00 - 2nd \$2.00- 3rd \$.1.00

15. EXHIBITS MUST BE REMOVED from the fair between 3-5pm on **Sunday (Fair Day)**. Any person removing exhibits before the stated time, without the prior consent of the Executive, will forfeit all prizes and money.

16. PRIZE MONEY and prizes must be collected no later than 6pm, on Fair Day, or it will be considered forfeited, unless notified of other arrangements. Prize money may be collected in the Fair Office between 2-5pm

15. AUCTION DONATIONS - Any fruits, vegetables or other exhibits that exhibitors wish to donate for our auction will be gratefully received to help with expenses, Please specify on the entry form and exhibit card where indicated.

16. THE FAIR ASSOCIATION is not responsible for any articles lost, damaged, or stolen.
